## BLOCK 3 - Log Cabin

CUT:

| 1 | 3 " Square | Center |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 1 Strip color A | $2^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF | Lightest Light |
| 1 Strip color B | $2^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF | Darkest Dark |
| 1 Strip color C | $2^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF | Medium Light |
| 1 Strip color D | $2^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF | Medium Dark |
| 1 Strip color E | $2^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF | Darkest Light |
| 1 Strip color F | $2^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF | Lightest Dark |

## SEW:

1. Lay Strip A face up under the presser foot and take a few stitches. Please the center square right side down and sew a few stitches past the square. Press the seam allowance away from the center square. Using your rotary cutter, square up the ends of the strip so that it is the same size as the center square.
2. Lay Strip A face up under the presser foot and take a few stitches, lay the unit just sewn face down with the strip is going under the needle first and the center square following. Press the seam allowance away from the center and trim this new strip even with the outside edges of the unit.
(I usually tell people "up, up and away". This means that every time you return to the machine after pressing and trimming the block 1 is face up, 2 the next strip is on the machine face up and 3 - the last strip you just added is furthest away from your body)
3. Lay Strip B face up and add the unit, press, trim
4. Add Strip B a second time. Each strip color is used twice
5. Continue in this manner until all the strips have been added
6. The block is complete when color $F$ has been used twice
